WILD10 involves senior leaders from science. politics, business, communications, and the arts. It is an international project for wild nature and human society that culminates in the 10th World Wilderness Congress (WWC), a global gathering of hearts and minds in Salamanca, Spain, 4-10 October 2013.

The future is ours to create — it depends on bold vision, collaboration, and positive action. These are the central elements of the World Wilderness Congress (WWC).

Established in 1977 in South Africa, the 1st WWC convened people of all races, sectors, and perspectives, global leaders and experts engaged in creating effective and cooperative solutions for wild nature and the future of all life. Defying the racist apartheid laws of the time, it was an "indaba" in the Zulu tradition of that country, calling all of the people to meet, to leave their weapons aside, and to work together to solve critical issues facing the nation. 2005

produces effective, positive, and practical results at global and local scale that protect wild nature while addressing the needs of human communities.

Wilderness provides solitude and spirit in our everbusy world. It also provides practical and essential "support services" that make possible life on earth. When wild nature is destroyed indiscriminately, the results are evident both historically and today: erratic and severe weather, poverty, lack of security, hunger, environmental refugees, social instability, and political confrontation.

WILD10 is an opportunity to say yes to a different world, and to expand hope, inspire and inform new thinking, and create positive solutions.
